

Thomas Haley · Bio

A native Oregonian, Thomas Haley has lived in Paris, France since the early 70's. He did his university studies in photography (University of Oregon), cinema (New York University), and art history (American University in Paris). He first worked as a photo-researcher for Magnum Photo Agency.

Since the early 80s, Haley has worked for SIPA PRESS, covering political conflict, man-made and natural disasters from Panama to Tian'anmen Square, the Balkans and the Middle East. His work on the Bhopal industrial accident in 1984 was awarded by the World Press Awards.

He covered the rise of People's Power in the Philippines and the fall of Ferdinand Marcos as well as the major events in eastern Europe that led to the fall of the Berlin Wall and Soviet communism.

He covered the Balkan conflict from most fronts since the outbreak of that war. Haley collaborates regularly with the major news weeklies in North America and Europe.

For the last ten years, his main interest and efforts have been in developing and realizing feature stories, such as Jesuits Around the World, the Narmada River Struggle, Buddhism in Mongolia, and others. He lives in Paris with his wife, Annick, and two sons.
